 Brothers. Should you choose to have Box Brothers ship or deliver your property, this
 uplift fee will be waived.
- Clients will have 5 days of free storage to retrieve their property or make arrangements with Box Brothers to pack and ship their property. Storage fees will begin to accrue on the 6th day of storage.
- Retrieval from the offsite warehouse is by appointment only. Clients must call 24 hours
 in advance. Clients can utilize the delivery services offered by Box Brothers or clients may
 make their own arrangements. Please call +1 (800) 942-6822.
- Box Brothers is available to ship internationally. They offer importing and exporting services. Clients can select either airfreight or ocean cargo delivery options, which range from door-to-port, door-to-airport with door-to-door service also available. Clients can ship one item, co-load or container load at a discounted rate through Box Brothers. Please call +1 (800) 942-6822 for more information.
- All purchases not designated for offsite storage will remain onsite at Bonhams for a period of 21 days beginning the date of the auction. CONDITIONS OF SALE

The following Conditions of Sale, as amended by any published or posted notices or verbal announcements during the sale, constitute the entire terms and conditions on which property listed in the catalog shall be offered for sale or sold by Bonhams & Butterfields Auctioneers Corp. and any consignor of such property for whom we act as agent. If live online bidding is available for the subject auction, additional terms and conditions of sale relating to online bidding will apply; see www.bonhams.com/WebTerms for the supplemental terms. As used herein, "Bonhams," "we" and "us" refer to Bonhams & Butterfields Auctioneers Corp.

- 1. As used herein, the term "bid price" means the price at which a lot is successfully knocked down to the purchaser. The term "purchase price" means the aggregate of (a) the bid price, (b) a PREMIUM retained by us and payable by the purchaser EQUAL TO 25% OF THE FIRST \$50,000 OF THE BID PRICE, 20% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE BID PRICE ABOVE \$50,000 UP TO AND INCLUDING \$1,000,000, AND 12% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE BID PRICE OVER \$1,000,000, and (c) unless the purchaser is exempt by law from the payment thereof, any California, Arizona, Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Pennsylvania, Texas, Washington, D.C., Washington state, or other state or local sales tax (or compensating use tax) and other applicable taxes.
- 2. On the fall of the auctioneer's hammer, the highest bidder shall have purchased the offered lot in accordance and subject to compliance with all of the conditions set forth herein and (a) assumes full risk and responsibility therefor, (b) if requested will sign a confirmation of purchase, and (c) will pay the purchase price in full or such part as we may require for all lots purchased. No lot may be transferred. Any person placing a bid as agent on behalf of another (whether or not such person has disclosed that fact or the identity of the principal) may be jointly and severally liable with the principal under any contract resulting from the acceptance of a bid.

Unless otherwise agreed, payment in good funds is due and payable within five (5) business days following the auction sale. Whenever the purchaser pays only a part of the total purchase price for one or more lots purchased, we may apply such payments, in our sole discretion, to the lot or lots we choose. Payment will not be deemed made in full until we have collected good funds for all amounts due.

Payment for purchases may be made in or by (a) cash, (b) cashier's check or money order, (c) personal check with approved credit drawn on a U.S. bank, (d) wire transfer or other immediate bank transfer, or (e) Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover credit, charge or debit card. A processing fee will be assessed on any returned checks. Please note that the amount of cash notes and cash equivalents that can be accepted from a given purchaser may be limited.

The purchaser grants us a security interest in the property, and we may retain as collateral security for the purchaser's obligations to us, any property and all monies held or received by us for the account of the purchaser, in our possession. We retain all rights of a secured party under the California Commercial Code. If the foregoing conditions or any other applicable conditions herein are not complied with, in addition to other remedies available to us and the consignor by law, including without limitation, the right to hold the purchaser liable for the purchase price, we at our option may either (a) cancel the sale, retaining as liquidated damages all payments made by the purchaser or (b) resell the property, either publicly or privately, and in such event the purchaser shall be liable for the payment of any deficiency plus all costs and expenses of both

- sales, our commission at our standard rates, all other charges due hereunder, attorneys' fees, expenses and incidental damages. In addition, where two or more amounts are owed in respect of different transactions by the purchaser to us, to Bonhams 1793 Limited and/ or to any of our other affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide within the Bonhams Group, we reserve the right to apply any monies paid in respect of a transaction to discharge any amount owed by the purchaser. If all fees, commissions, premiums, bid price and other sums due to us from the purchaser are not paid promptly as provided in these Conditions of Sale, we reserve the right to impose a finance charge equal to 1.5% per month on all amounts due to us beginning on the 31st day following the sale until payment is received, in addition to other remedies available to us by law.
- 3. We reserve the right to withdraw any property and to divide and combine lots at any time before such property's auction. Unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale, all bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog and no lots shall be divided or combined for sale.
- 4. We reserve the right to reject a bid from any bidder, to split any bidding increment, and to advance the bidding in any manner the auctioneer may decide. In the event of any dispute between bidders, or in the event the auctioneer doubts the validity of any bid, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion either to determine the successful bidder or to re-offer and resell the article in dispute. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sales records shall be conclusive in all respects.
- 5. If we are prevented by fire, theft or any other reason whatsoever from delivering any property to the purchaser or a sale otherwise cannot be completed, our liability shall be limited to the sum actually paid therefor by the purchaser and shall in no event include any compensatory, incidental or consequential damages.
- 6. If a lot is offered subject to a reserve, we may implement such reserve by bidding on behalf of the consignor, whether by opening bidding or continuing bidding in response to other bidders until reaching the reserve. If we have an interest in an offered lot and the proceeds therefrom other than our commissions, we may bid therefor to protect such interest. CONSIGNORS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BID ON THEIR OWN ITEMS.
- 7. All statements contained in the catalog or in any bill of sale, condition report, invoice or elsewhere as to authorship, period, culture, source, origin, measurement, quality, rarity, provenance, importance, exhibition and literature of historical relevance, or physical condition ARE QUALIFIED STATEMENTS OF OPINION AND NOT REPRESENTATIONS OR WARRANTIES. No employee or agent of Bonhams is authorized to make on our behalf or on that of the consignor any representation or warranty, oral or written, with respect to any property.
- 8. All purchased property shall be removed from the premises at which the sale is conducted by the date(s) and time(s) set forth in the "Buyer's Guide" portion of this catalog. Property designated with a "W" and associated purchased lots, if not removed promptly following sale, will be transferred to an offsite warehouse at the purchaser's risk and expense, as set forth in more detail in the "Buyer's Guide." Purchased property that is permitted to remain onsite at Bonhams' facility should be removed at the purchaser's expense not later than 5:00 p.m. Pacific Time five (5) business days following the date of the sale. If not so removed, a storage fee of \$5.00 per lot per day will be payable to us by the purchaser beginning at the close of the

- 21st day following the sale, and we may thereafter transfer such property to an offsite warehouse at the purchaser's risk and expense. Accounts must be settled in full before property will be released. Packing and handling of purchased lots are the responsibility of the purchaser. Bonhams can provide packing and shipping services for certain items as noted in the "Buyer's Guide" section of the catalog.
- 9. The copyright in the text of the catalog and the photographs, digital images and illustrations of lots in the catalog belong to Bonhams or its licensors. You will not reproduce or permit anyone else to reproduce such text, photographs, digital images or illustrations without our prior written consent.
- 10. These Conditions of Sale shall bind the successors and assigns of all bidders and purchasers and inure to the benefit of our successors and assigns. No waiver, amendment or modification of the terms hereof (other than posted notices or oral announcements during the sale) shall bind us unless specifically stated in writing and signed by us. If any part of these Conditions of Sale is for any reason invalid or unenforceable, the rest shall remain valid and enforceable.
- 11. These Conditions of Sale and the purchaser's and our respective rights and obligations hereunder are governed by the laws of the State of California. By bidding at an auction, each purchaser and bidder agrees to be bound by these Conditions of Sale. Any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this agreement, or the breach, termination or validity thereof, brought by or against Bonhams (but not including claims brought against the consignor by the purchaser of lots consigned hereunder) shall be resolved by the procedures set forth below.

Mediation and Arbitration Procedures

- (a) Within 30 days of written notice that there is a dispute, the parties or their authorized and empowered representatives shall meet by telephone and/or in person to mediate their differences. If the parties agree, a mutually acceptable mediator shall be selected and the parties will equally share such mediator's fees. The mediator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling mediations. Any communications made during the mediation process shall not be admissible in any subsequent arbitration, mediation or judicial proceeding. All proceedings and any resolutions thereof shall be confidential, and the terms governing arbitration set forth in paragraph (c) below shall govern.
- (b) If mediation does not resolve all disputes between the parties, or in any event no longer than 60 days after receipt of the written notice of dispute referred to above, the parties shall submit the dispute for binding arbitration before a single neutral arbitrator. Such arbitrator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling arbitrations. Such arbitrator shall make all appropriate disclosures required by law. The arbitrator shall be drawn from a panel of a national arbitration service agreed to by the parties, and shall be selected as follows: (i) If the national arbitration service has specific rules or procedures, those rules or procedures shall be followed; (ii) If the national arbitration service does not have rules or procedures for the selection of an arbitrator, the arbitrator shall be an individual jointly agreed to by the parties. If the parties cannot agree on a national arbitration service, the arbitration shall be conducted by the American Arbitration Association, and the arbitrator shall be selected in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator's award shall be in writing and shall set forth findings of fact and legal conclusions.

CONDITIONS OF SALE - CONTINUED

- (c) Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties or provided by the published rules of the national arbitration service:
- (i) the arbitration shall occur within 60 days following the selection of the arbitrator;
- (ii) the arbitration shall be conducted in the designated location, as follows: (A) in any case in which the subject auction by Bonhams took place or was scheduled to take place in the State of New York or Connecticut or the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the arbitration shall take place in New York City, New York; (B) in all other cases, the arbitration shall take place in the city of San Francisco, California; and
- (iii) discovery and the procedure for the arbitration shall be as follows:
- (A) All arbitration proceedings shall be confidential;
- (B) The parties shall submit written briefs to the arbitrator no later than 15 days before the arbitration commences;
- (C) Discovery, if any, shall be limited as follows: (I) Requests for no more than 10 categories of documents, to be provided to the requesting party within 14 days of written request therefor; (II) No more than two (2) depositions per party, provided however, the deposition(s) are to be completed within one (1) day; (III) Compliance with the above shall be enforced by the arbitrator in accordance with California law;
- (D) Each party shall have no longer than eight (8) hours to present its position. The entire hearing before the arbitrator shall not take longer than three (3) consecutive days;
- (E) The award shall be made in writing no more than 30 days following the end of the proceeding. Judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered by any court having jurisdiction thereof.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, and except as required by applicable arbitration rules, each party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs in connection with the proceedings and shall share equally the fees and expenses of the arbitrator.

Limited Right of Rescission

If within one (1) year from the date of sale, the original purchaser (a) gives written notice to us alleging that the identification of Authorship (as defined below) of such lot as set forth in the BOLD TYPE heading of the catalog description of such lot (as amended by any saleroom notices or verbal announcements during the sale) is not substantially correct based on a fair reading of the catalog (including the terms of any glossary contained therein), and (b) within 10 days after such notice returns the lot to us in the same condition as at the time of sale, and (c) establishes the allegation in the notice to our satisfaction (including by providing one or more written opinions by recognized experts in the field, as we may reasonably require), then the sale of such lot will be rescinded and, unless we have already paid to the consignor monies owed him in connection with the sale, the original purchase price will be refunded.

If, prior to receiving such notice from the original purchaser alleging such defect, we have paid the consignor monies owed him in connection with the sale, we shall pay the original purchaser the amount of our commissions, any other sale proceeds to which we are entitled and applicable taxes received from the purchaser on the sale and make demand on the consignor to pay the balance of the original purchase price to the original purchaser. Should the consignor fail to pay such amount promptly, we may disclose the identity of the consignor and assign to the original purchaser our rights against the consignor with respect to the lot the sale of which is sought to be rescinded. Upon such disclosure and assignment, any liability of Bonhams as consignor's agent with respect to said lot shall automatically terminate.

The foregoing limited right of rescission is available to the original purchaser only and may not be assigned to or relied upon by any subsequent transferee of the property sold. The purchaser hereby accepts the benefit of the consignor's warranty of title and other representations and warranties made by the consignor for the purchaser's benefit. 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FURNITURE

George III Mahogany Chest of Drawers

Third Quarter 18th Century

This heading, with date included, means that the piece is, in our opinion, of the period indicated with no major alterations or restorations.

George III Mahogany Chest of Drawers

This heading, without the inclusion of the date, indicates that, in our opinion, the piece, while basically of the period, has undergone significant restoration and alteration.

George III Style Mahogany Chest of Drawers

The inclusion of the word "style" in the heading indicates that, in our opinion, the piece was made as an intentional reproduction of an earlier style.

BRONZES

Antoine-Louis Barye

This heading indicates that the casting and patination were done by the artist or with his direct authorization or supervision.

Cast After a Model by Antoine-Louis Barye

This heading indicates that the casting and patination of a known Barye model were done by another, i.e., artisans at the F. Barbedienne or other foundry.

CERAMICS

Meissen Porcelain Cup and Saucer

Late 19th Century

This heading states that the cup and saucer were made at the Meissen factory in the last quarter of the 19th Century.

Meissen Porcelain Cup and a Saucer

Late 19th Century

Again, this heading states that the cup and saucer were made at the Meissen factory in the last quarter of the 19th Century, but it also indicates that the cup and saucer may not have been "born" together.

Meissen Porcelain Cup and Saucer

Circa 1900

This heading states that the cup and saucer were made at the Meissen factory around the year 1900.

'Meissen' Porcelain Cup and a Saucer 19th Century

This heading states that the cup and saucer are of Meissen style, and although of the date specified, not necessarily made at the Meissen factory.

Meissen Porcelain Cup and Saucer

This heading, without a specific date, simply states that the pieces were made at the Meissen factory but does not specify when, implying that their age is questionable.



Mrs. T. Charlton Henry (Julia Rush Biddle) (1886-1978) of the Philadelphia Biddle's was a socialite and museum benefactor who split her time between Philadelphia and Switzerland. She was noted in 1968 Life magazine as one of the "Grande Dames Who Grace America" and described as a *A lover of fine clothes and a devoted walker, she is trim and doll-like and has been named to the Best-Dressed Hall of Fame*. Later in life she became an avid jogger and was dubbed the 'Aristocratic Grande Dame of Jogging'

Her 1965 portrait by Diane Arbus (1923-1971), currently in the collection of The Metropolitan Museum of Art, 2001.399, was first published in *Harper's Bazaar*. The accompanying text describes Mrs. T. Charlton Henry as weighing a fragile, feminine ninety pounds, but moves through life like Trojan.

By all accounts, Mrs. T. Charlton Henry was an influential and fashionable woman; therefore, one can easily imagine how she was attracted to this portrait of the mighty Queen adorned in a highly elaborate and symbolic gown.

Notes:

Once attributed to Taddeo Zuccero (1529 - 1566), the Rainbow Portrait is now attributed Isaac Oliver (c.1565 - 1617). Oliver was best known for his portrait miniatures depicting many of luminaries of the Elizabethan age.


The original Rainbow portrait, circa 1600, is in the collection of the Marquess of Salisbury at Hatfield House.

Henry Bone, (enameler of the offered lot), was born in Truro, the son of a successful cabinet-maker. He apprenticed as a china-painter to William Cookworthy and then to Richard Champion of Bristol. After the failure of the later factory, he began exhibiting enamels at the Royal Academy. He was recognized, then as today, as a successful miniaturist of portraits and copies after old master paintings; many of them produced in a large size not seen before.

In 1800 he was appointed Enamel Painter to George III and subsequently to George IV and William IV and in 1811 was elected a Royal Academian (RA). He proudly incorporated these references in the lengthy inscriptions on the backs of his miniatures, as seen in these two offered lots.

Bone's largest series of works comprised approximately eighty-five historical portraits from the time of Elizabeth I, and it is probable that the offered enamels were of this series. Unfortunately, despite the masterful quality, the Elizabethan collection did not prove a financial success, and many were sold at auction after his death in 1834.







Crown Point Gold and Silver Mining Company


One of the richest mines of the Comstock Lode, the Crown Point Mine was staked in 1859 between the Belcher and Kentuck Mines and was 540' long. Superintendent John P. Jones' discovery of a silver bonanza at the 900' level in 1871 revived general interest in the Comstock after initial mining had exhausted surface deposits. In 1886 the Belcher and Crown Point Mines combined to mill low grade ore in the upper levels of both mines. In 1915 the Yellow Jacket, Crown Point, and Belcher mines consolidated into the Jacket-Crown Point-Belcher Mines Company; in 1920 they became part of the United Comstock Mining Company.

Koehler & Ritter

Koehler & Ritter were silversmiths and retailers of flatware and hollowware, but also jewelers who often incorporating gold quartz in their pieces, as well as diamonds and enamel. Gotthard Koehler (1823 - 1894) and Charles Ritter (1840 -) came to San Francisco as German immigrants who joined a thriving community of German silversmiths and began their careers working under the leadership of Friedrich R. Reichel (c. 1824-1867). The two associates took over the firm in 1867 when Reichel died, advertising themselves as "Successors to F.R. Reichel" and continued working at the firm's original location at 620 Merchant Street.

In the 1870's their business flourished and they relocated to the more fashionable address of 26 Post Street. Unfortunately, business was not as successful in this location and they ended their partnership in 1885.



In 1811 Pierre-Antoine Bellange became a cabinetmaker for the Imperial *Garde Meuble*, and retained the same functions under the reign of Louis XVIII, during which he furnished the Pavillon de Saint-Ouen. Charles X assigned him to the Directorate General of the Crown Furniture, and Louis Philippe appointed him as "Cabinetmaker of the King", a title he kept until his death.

Among the earliest and most important pieces of furniture in the White House collection are pieces ordered by President Monroe from Bellangé to refurnish the mansion after the fire of 1814. Of the pieces he purchased, nine remain in the White House today.






According to the Steinway & Co. records, the piano was completed on August 19, 1924 as a Model L Player Piano. It was then shipped to the Paris firm of L. Alavoine et Compagnie for decoration. It was delivered to the Aeolian Company New York City on September 21, 1925 for one of Aeolian's clients. This superb piano is illustrated on page 169 of Steinway, Ronald V. Ratcliffe, Henry Z. Steinway and identified as a Hamburg Steinway, designed for the Russian embassy in Paris and owned by the St. Anthony Hotel in San Antonio. The player mechanism was removed some time ago and the piano has been restrung for use as a manual instrument. This was probably done at the time the piano was installed in the St. Anthony Hotel.

The St. Anthony Hotel opened in January, 1909. The hotel was purchased in 1935 by Ralph W. Morrison who wanted to elevate the hotel to world class prestige. Mr. Morrison was an avid traveler and throughout his ownership purchased French Empire as well as 19th century French furniture to adorn the hotel's public rooms. In a newsletter from the 1983 National Preservation Conference, held at the St. Anthony, Mr. Morrison is mentioned as having purchased the piano "made for a czar" from the Russian Embassy in Paris in 1938 for the price of \$27,000.

The hotel changed ownership a few times but the piano remained in the lobby as part of the famous Peacock Alley cocktail lounge. Eleanor Roosevelt, President Eisenhower, General MacArthur and Princess Grace of Monaco are just a few noted persons who visited that lounge. The piano remained in the lobby until the early 1990's when it was moved to California by one of the owners. A newspaper article by David Anthony Richelieu in the San Antonio Express mourned the loss of one of San Antonio's treasures when the piano left the hotel for California. In that article Mr. Richelieu dismissed the story about the piano having been owned by Czar Nicholas II. He did, however, indicate the piano was made in 1924 for the Soviet Embassy in Paris and was later installed in the Soviet Embassy in Washington "where Morrison paid \$27,000" for the piano.

The superb marquetry and casting of the mounts point to a highly skilled ebeniste and bronze maker and are of the quality one would expect of the late 19th/early 20th century makers such as François Linke or Joseph-Emmanuel Zwiener. L. Alavoine et Compagnie were important interior designers who maintained offices in Paris and New York. The Plaza Hotel, as well as several Stanford White buildings, were decorated in the Beaux Art style by that firm. It is not known whom they commissioned to decorate the offered piano. On page 175 of the Ratcliffe book, there is an image of a Louis XV style Steinway art case that is mounted with many of the identical mounts on this piano. A Steinway piano sold by Sotheby's, New York, lot 15, January 27, 2012 bears many of the identical mounts found on the offered piano. These include the putto seated among clouds playing a lyre, the lush floral cast chutes, scrolling leaf cast sabots and some of the encadrements.

There is no known documentation to substantiate the piano being made for or placed in the Russian Embassy either in Paris or Washington, D.C. The Russian Embassy was originally a Beaux Art mansion built for Mrs. George Pullman in 1910. It was sold to the Russian government in 1913 and has been a residence for Russian Ambassadors to the U.S. since that time.

The ancient technique of mosaic was revived in Europe during the 16th century after Roman antiquities, including mosaics, began to be unearthed in archaeological excavations. Techniques developed and improved, with mosaic images becoming increasingly subtle as the individual glass pieces, known as tesserae, became smaller, and the range of available colour pigments grew larger. In 1588 Ferdinand de' Medici established the Grand Ducal workshop in Florence, which supported and patronised the specialised art of hardstone mosaics. Many craftsmen were trained in Florence before setting up studios around Italy. Pietre dure mosaics were produced in Florence, Milan and Rome, and were emulated in Prague and St. Petersburg. Soon craftsmen were attempting to create the perfect 'stone paintings' through the clever exploitation of the natural variations in pigment of the stones. In the 18th century the glass micromosaic technique was developed in the Vatican Mosaic Workshop in Rome, and plaques depicting views of Ancient Rome were among the favorite Grand Tour souveniers.



This composition is known in various 16th century bronze plaquettes, and the style and technique points to an Emilian sculptor. The bronze plagues are dated 1561 and so the original design must pre-date that year. A plaquette of almost identical form to the present marble relief is in the National Gallery of Art, Washington DC (Widener Collection). Intriguingly, it is signed PARM INVENT. Numerous attributions have been suggested for the artist based on this inscription, including the medallist Gian Federico Bonzagni, called Parmese who signed himself with an abbreviation of his Christian name, followed by PARM. Others have suggested that the original composition was after a now lost drawing or print by Parmigianino, who died in 1540. In more recent literature A. Geber has refuted these attributions but we are now no closer to firmly attributing the plaquettes or the present marble relief.

A pendant plaquette depicting the Lamentation, so similar in style and form that it must certainly be by the same hand, is also in the National Gallery of Art, Washington (Widener Collection), and an example was sold at Bonhams, in the Adams Collection, May 23, 1996, lot 160. An example of the Adoration of the Shepherds plaquette was sold at Sotheby's, Paris, October 18, 2006, lot 9. A further version is in the National Museum of Scotland. No other marble versions are known.

Chriemhilde (or Kriemhild) is one of the protagonists of the German medieval epic poem, "The Nibelungenlied." The sister of Gunter, king of the Burgundians, Chriemhilde weds Siegfried, the heroic dragon-slaying crown prince of Xanten. Due to a dispute between Chriemhilde and King Gunter's wife, Brünhild of Iceland, Siegfried is ignobly murdered by one of Gunter's vassals. Chriemhilde, who blames her brother the King for the killing, travels east across the Danube, marries Attila the Hun, and plans her revenge against the Burgundians. The epic ends in a bloody slaughter of all of the Burgundians at the hand of Chriemhilde, and Chriemhilde's own death under the sword of the monk Hildebrand.

Freidrich Goldscheider, aware of the contemporary pre-eminence of French terracottas and in order to better compete in the French market, opened a factory on the rue de Paradis in Paris in 1891. He employed French artists to create the models he would produce there, including Charpentier, Alouard, Levasseur and Carrier-Belleuse. Because of the anti-German sentiment present in France during the decades following the Franco-Prussian War, Goldscheider attempted to make his productions (and even his artist's names) as Franco-sympathetic as possible. Thus, the present model was known on the French market as "Frédègonde," referring to a Merovingian queen in a French legend with some similarities to the Nibelungen saga.

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
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
