



The Library of Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg

You don't have to be a student of the law to love the "Notorious RBG." A brilliant lawyer and jurist responsible for some of the most eventful legal decisions of the last 50 years, Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg became something of a media darling in her later years thanks to her sizzling dissents in a number of high-profile cases ("You've been Ginsburned!" the SNL skit goes). My favorite is her condemnation of the conservative majority's gutting of the Voting Rights Act: "Throwing out preclearance when it has worked and is continuing to work to stop discriminatory changes is like throwing away your umbrella in a rainstorm because you are not getting wet."

Ginsburg, however, called out ideas, not people. She firmly believed that we can "disagree without being disagreeable." Her friendship with arch-conservative Justice Antonin Scalia is a model of how people with differing opinions and world views can not just co-exist peacefully, but truly enjoy and appreciate one another in public and private life.

At every step of her life, Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a trailblazer. She was one of 9 women in her class at Harvard Law, met with hostility from professors and deans who accused her of taking the place of a man. Or of neglecting her infant daughter. Then, while the baby was still little and both she and her husband were still in law school, Marty battled cancer. Ruth took care of both and still made the Harvard Law Review. After graduation, she battled the rampant sexism that made it difficult for her to obtain a judicial clerkship and a position at a white shoe law firm. Ginsburg was so brilliant and talented she was able to overcome the obstacles thrown in her way, but instead of breezing through and letting the door slam behind her, she held it open for those of us (not as brilliant, but just as deserving) who followed.

Had her career ended as the first female tenured law professor at Columbia, or as the founder of the Women's Rights Project at the ACLU, or had she sat no higher in the judiciary than the Court of Appeals, she still would have been a person of tremendous importance to the 20th century. But it was her appointment as only the second woman to sit on the Supreme Court, and her powerful opinions, both majority and dissenting, that have made her such a consequential figure.

One reason we are so moved by Ruth Bader Ginsburg is because we can see and feel the impact she has had on our lives every day. Reproductive freedom. Equal access to educational opportunities. Marriage equality. Gender equality. Civil Rights. Voting Rights. Ginsburg's words and actions have changed the world for the better for so many of us.

I will tell you a not-so-hidden secret: the auction business is powered by women. At every level, from inventory control to top management--at least here at Bonhams, but I think at other houses as well--women appear in equal or greater numbers to men. And we are very grateful to the legacy of Ruth Bader Ginsburg, whose trailblazing path has made our (less significant, but still rewarding) careers possible.

What did we find among the bookshelves of Ginsburg's Watergate apartment? Like any working library built over decades, we found relics from the whole arc of her career. Textbooks from her law school days that reveal her focus and dedication. Her bound copy of the 1957-1958 Harvard Law Review. A copy of her first published book. A great quantity of legal titles and offprints relating to constitutional law. Booklength histories of major court cases like US v. Virginia, Bush v. Gore, and Citizens United. Books inscribed to Ginsburg by public intellectuals and celebrities. And volumes and volumes of books on all topics—the law, Judaica, literature, history, music, art, travel. Justice Ginsburg is right: reading is the key that opens doors, and more reading makes dreams come true. We invite all of you to browse the Justice's bookshelves, and dream.





Civil Procedure is a required course for first year law students; in it, students explore the process of civil litigation from the introduction of a lawsuit through the final judgement. Austin Wakeman Scott (1884-1981) was a longtime Harvard Law Professor who specialized in Trusts and Estates law. This book, according to the preface, was published to support his Civil Procedure class. Published in 1922, it was still in use when Ginsburg arrived in 1956.

The first chapter, "Venue and Jurisdiction," bears the most underscoring and annotation, as a young Ginsburg seeks to absorb the important points regarding transitory and local actions. In Chapter II, "Jurisdiction over Nonresidents," she underscores the arguments regarding "implied consent" particularly in regard to foreign and domestic corporations. There are minimal notations in the chapters "Trial by Jury," "Excessive and Inadequate Damages," and "Amendments and Jeofails."

Civil Procedure was a formative course for Ginsburg, whose mastery of the civil litigation system as a lawyer led to such landmark decisions as Roe v. Wade and Reed v. Reed, not to mention her spectacular judicial career. It is also one of the courses she taught during her long career as a law professor.

From approximately 1620 until 1845 the conveyance by lease and release was the most commonly used method of conveying land in England. It was not necessary for the parties to go upon the land as in the case of a transfer by feoffment, nor was it necessary for the conveyee to make an actual entry as in the case of a transfer of an estate for years by agreement and entry. Moreover, the requirement of recording and payment of a fee therefor under the terms of the Statute of Enrolments was circumvented. In actual practise the bargain and sale, in the form of a deed, and the release would be drawn up on the same paper, the bargain and sale being dated the day before the release. It was customary to insert a consideration of five shillings in the deed of bargain and sale, although in fact it was rarely ever paid. The mere recital of consideration, without actual payment, was considered sufficient to raise a use. As stated by Chancellor Kent: "The rule requiring a consideration to raise a use, has become merely nominal, and a matter of form; for if a sum of money be mentioned, it is never an inquiry whether it was actually paid, and the smallest sum possible is sufficient: nay, it has been solemnly adjudged, that a pepper corn was sufficient to raise a use." 





GINSBURG'S PERSONAL COPY, ANNOTATED.

Ginsburg joined the *Harvard Law Review* in her second year, one of only two women on staff that year. Under the leadership of Richard N. Goodwin (1931-2018, speechwriter and special counsel to John F. Kennedy, later special assistant to Lyndon B. Johnson), the Review published works by Archibald Cox, Alexander Bickel, and Benjamin Kaplan, among others. The year Ginsburg spent on the Harvard Law Review was also the year her husband Martin was diagnosed with cancer and underwent two surgeries and radiation therapy, making the excellence of her work that much more impressive.

This volume is Ginsburg's personal copy of the *Harvard Law Review* publications in which she participated. Her annotations are particularly heavy in two sections: the first is an essay titled "Problems of Parallel State and Federal Remedies" (pp 513-526), the third article in the "review" section of Vol 71, number 4. In the sub-chapter, "Suit in a Federal Court," Ginsburg has heavily underscored text relating to Hurn v. Oursler, a 1933 case outlining what conditions govern the use of the doctrine of pendent jurisdiction. The other heavily annotated article in this volume is "Price-Restrictive Patent Licenses Under the Sherman Act" by Helmut F. Furth (pp 815-842); Ginsburg underscores and annotates Furth's history of the price-fixing patent and the court's regulation of the same.

Several of Austin's ideas are discussed further on. Here we note two of the chief criticisms of Austin's theory: That he took no account of what the law ought to be; and that he placed excessive reliance on logic in the solution of legal problems. The first of these is based upon his statement, made in defining the scope of "Jurisprudence"

general jurisprudence, or the philosophy of positive law, is concerned with law as it necessarily is, rather than law as it cought to be; with law as it must be, be if good or bod, rather than law as it must be, if it be good." **

In this same passage Austin explained that general jurisprudence was not concurred with "the science of legislation", by which be meant the principles of legislation set forth by his older friend and intellectual leader, Jeremy Bentham, a Bentham believed that a code of laws could be so clearly drawn as to do away with "judge-made" law (§ 4.43); hence he separated the ethical questions of law-making, which he called "deentology", or the science of legislation, from the analytical problems, which he called "juris-produce". Austin obediently followed this division of labor set forth by his master. Yet Austin was not indifferent to the goodness or badness of laws. He devoted three of his first six (pen-lished) lectures to discussing the principle of utility (§ 4.41). At the end of his lecture notes, he recognized that it was impossible

After Martin Ginsburg graduated Harvard Law School in 1958 and accepted a position as a tax lawyer in New York City, Ruth Bader Ginsburg approached the Dean of the Harvard Law School to ask if, in order for her family to live together, she could finish her Harvard degree by taking her last year of classes at Columbia Law School. He refused, so Ginsburg transferred to Columbia to finish her degree, becoming the first woman to serve on two major law reviews and tying for first in her class at Columbia.

Patterson wrote this book for his Jurisprudence course at Columbia which Ginsburg took in the 1958-59 school year. First written in 1940, Jurisprudence was circulated in mimeo form before finally appearing in print in 1953. In his introduction, Patterson declares the book's purpose "to present concisely and clearly the ideas of the legal order and the general theories about law which have been and are most influential on the law of the United States...." A reviewer of the period referred to the book as the "ABCs of jurisprudence."


This volume is heavily underscored and annotated by Ginsburg throughout, not doubt as she prepared for classwork and exams. It's not hard to see in her annotations, however, the theoretical


foundations of her own "gradualist" philosophy, particularly in the chapter on "Pragmatism in Legal Philosophy" which begins with a discussion of Oliver Wendell Holmes, Roscoe Pound and William James. Ginsburg underscores, "What legal pragmatists did, for the most part, was to point out that the method of solving a legal problem, by finding an established legal rule and applying it logically to the facts, was not as 'certain' as the formal statement of rules and facts in the judicial opinion, nor as the statement of rules in the treatise or the statute book, made it appear to be." On the next pages she underscores Patterson's words on Pluralism, the assumption that there may be more than one or two kinds of reality: "pluralism is the piecemeal analysis of the diverse issues of diverse—physical, biological, psychological, linguistic and social—which resist solution by a single formula."


Ginsburg's underscoring and annotations are found throughout the book: in the chapter "Kelsen's Official Hierarchy" regarding the hierarchy of norms and rules in law; in "The Law of Judicial Precedents" (including a paragraph on "stare decisis" and logical indeterminacy of precedent); in "Historical and Evolutionary Theories of Law"; in "Utilitarianism: Bentham and Jhering" and in particular the sub-chapter on the "pleasure-pain principle" in ethics and legislation; and in "Sociological Jurisprudence and American Legal Realism" (particularly the sub-chapter on Roscoe Pound).

A rare and important artifact of Ginsburg's evolution as a jurist.



RUTH BADER GINSBURG'S COPY OF HER FIRST BOOK, PUBLISHED AS PART OF THE COLUMBIA PROJECT ON INTERNATIONAL PROCEDURE. After law school and a prestigious clerkship, and faced with a job market that offered women substantially lower salaries than their male counterparts, Ginsburg opted instead to participate in the Columbia University Project on International Procedure. This book on *Civil Procedure in Sweden* is the first publication of the project as well as her first book publication. Her interest in international procedure would color her judicial view throughout her career. Additionally, Sweden's egalitarian society—where two-income families were normal and women openly debated shared parenting roles—opened Ginsburg's eyes to the pervasive inequalities affecting women in America.

Our Bodies, Ourselves was originally self-published by 12 women calling themselves the "Boston Women's Health Collective" as a 193 page pamphlet in 1970 (pages were originally issued loose to be stapled, or hole punched for a binder), and by 1973 when the first commercial edition was released the book had sold over 250,000 copies. Today, it has sold over 4 million copies and been named by the Library of Congress as one of the 88 Books That Shaped America.

Judy Norsigian was a founding member of the Boston Collective, as well as an author or editor of each of the nine editions the book went through until 2011. The cover marketing from the 2011 edition reads, "The bestselling classic, informing and inspiring women across generations." A wonderful association copy.






Sex Discrimination and the Law was the second legal handbook on sex discrimination, following Ginsburg's Sex-Based Discrimination published in 1974. The women responsible for the work-Susan Ross, Barbara Babcock, and Ann Freedman (as well as Eleanor Holmes Norton)—worked closely with Ruth Bader Ginsburg as they forged the legal framework for women's rights, through law school curricula and the court system, largely under the ACLU Women's Rights Project headed by Ginsburg. Each of these women, as well as later co-authors Copelon, Rhode, Taub and Williams, have played outsized roles in the development of women's equality and civil rights in conjunction with and in the wake of Ruth Bader Ginsburg. Indeed, it was Babcock, as Jimmy Carter's head of the Justice Department's Civil Division, who fought for Ruth Bader Ginsburg's first federal appointment, against

the wishes of the attorney general, writing in an important memo to Carter: "Women are not fungible ... For a very visible appointment that could lead to the Supreme Court, it has to be Ruth," noting that not naming someone so well qualified who had also paid her dues would be "a slap in the face." Ginsburg credited Babcock with her position in a 2018 interview. The warm inscriptions in this landmark book are a testament to the role Ginsburg played both in redefining American life and gender equality, and in the lives of the individual women who worked with her.



The Equal Rights Amendment (ERA) is a proposed amendment to the Constitution designed to guarantee equal rights regardless of sex. Originally written in the 1920s, a version was passed by Congress in 1972 and sent to the states for ratification with a deadline of March 22, 1979. Through 1977 the amendment received 35 of the necessary 38 ratifications and was supported by both Republicans and Democrats. It seems destined to pass until Phyllis Schlafly mobilized conservative women in opposition, arguing that the ERA would harm

housewives, cause women to be drafted into the military, and do away with protections for women like alimony and child custody. As the 1979 deadline approached, Congress held hearings at which Ginsburg and other experts testified, and approved a 3 year extension of the ratification progress. No additional state, however, ratified the amendment in the extended time period.

Ginsburg testified before both the House and Senate Subcommittees on Civil and Constitutional Rights. Her testimony appears on pp 125-157 of the House report, and in her copy she has corrected small transcription errors in her testimony. Her testimony before the Senate subcommittee the following year appears on pp 262-286 of that document.

At Clarence Thomas' Senate confirmation hearings in 1991, his former colleague Anita Hill testified that he had sexually harassed her while he was her supervisor at the United States Department of Education and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. The hearings set off a firestorm of controversy, raising public consciousness about sexual harassment in the workplace even as Thomas accused Hill and others of engaging in a "high-tech lynching." Thomas was ultimately confirmed to the court, where he was joined two years later by Ginsburg.

This volume is a collection of essays by historians, sociologists, activists and legal scholars on the impact of the Hill-Thomas hearings. Topics include how race and gender influenced the hearings and laws that followed, how to stop sexual harassment in the workplace, and how the hearings were represented in media and popular culture, among others.






The United States brought suit against the Virginia Military Institute alleging its male-only admissions policy was unconstitutional and violated the 14th amendment's equal protection clause. The case was argued before the Supreme Court in January of 1996, and in June of that year, the court ruled 7-1 that the policy was unconstitutional, that the single-sex education did not contribute to education diversity, and that the alternative provided for female students did not offer the same benefits as VMI. Ginsburg authored the majority opinion which remains one of the most significant of her career on the court.

Poitier, like Ginsburg, is known for breaking barriers. His emergence on the theater and film scene in the late 1950s showcased his formidable talent, but the provocative roles he took on in *Raisin in the Sun* (on Broadway and on film), *In the Heat of the Night*, and *Guess Who's Coming to Dinner?* directly confronted issues of racial prejudice, changing the way those issues were address in film and drama. In addition to being the first African-American actor to earn an Academy Award for Best Actor, for *Lilies of the Field* (1963), he also was recognized with an Honorary Academy Award in 2001, a Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Film Institute, the Cecil B. DeMille Award from the Hollywood Foreign Press Association, a BAFTA Fellowship, was made a Knight Commander of the British Empire by Queen Elizabeth in 1974, and was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Obama in 2011.





Her opinion concludes, "In sum, the Court's conclusion that a constitutionally adequate recount is impractical is a prophecy the Court's own judgment will not allow to be tested. Such an untested prophecy should not decide the Presidency of the United States. / I dissent."

On May 26, 2002, Ruth Bader Ginsburg delivered the Baccalaureate address to the senior class of Brown University. Her speech, both warm and personal, laid out her personal definition of feminism.

In the letter from the University included with the diploma, Ginsburg is described thus: "Courageous pioneer, stalwart feminist, brilliant jurist, outspoken advocate, you have never chosen the easy path, always holding yourself to the highest personal and professional standards. Cherishing your role as public servant, you have championed the rights of all people, men and women, crafting well-reasoned decisions with both eloquence and precision. 
Lilly Ledbetter worked as a supervisor at a Goodyear Plant in Jacksonville, AL for 19 years, learning toward the end of her tenure that she was making thousands of dollars a year less than her male counterparts with similar seniority and experience. She sued for sex discrimination and her case went all the way to the Supreme Court, where it was rejected because she had not filed her case within the 180 days of the discriminatory policy that led to her lower paycheck, even though she was not aware of the discrepancy until years later. Ginsburg famously dissented in the Ledbetter case, and the first piece of legislation signed into law by President Barack Obama was the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act, which loosened the timelines for the filing of a discrimination suit. Ginsburg kept a framed copy of the Lilly Ledbetter Fair Pay Act in her chambers at the Supreme Court.

The first title in this lot is Ledbetter's memoir covering her life, her career, and the litigation that led to the Supreme Court and the Fair Pay Act. The second title is an anthology of poetry by contemporary women inspired by Ledbetter's story.



Citizens United v. Federal Election Commission was a landmark case argued before the U.S. Supreme Court in 2009 and decided in 2010. The court's conservative majority determined that the free speech clause of the first amendment prohibited the government from restricting independent expenditures for political campaigns by corporations. The decision ushered in the era of big-money campaigns and the super-PAC (political action committee). Ginsburg joined the dissent authored by Justice John Paul Stevens, who wrote, "A democracy cannot function effectively when its constituent members believe laws are being bought and sold."








Ginsburg shared Breyer's views on the importance of considering international law-not surprising given her early studies of the Swedish legal system.








Schreck's play was first produced in 2016 and went to Broadway in 2019, winning both an Obje and New York Drama Critics Circle award for Best American Play as well as two Tony awards, and was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize. The play closes with a voice recording of Ruth Bader Ginsburg asking the question, "When will there be enough women on the court?" and answering her own question: "My answer is, when there are 9." In June 2019 Ginsburg attended the Broadway production, and met Schreck backstage. As Schreck recalled in an interview with Time magazine:

"We all were speechless. Thursday Williams, one of our great debaters [who is featured in the final segment of the show], always had an RBG pencil tucked behind her ear when she performed. That night, she thought the audience was very out of control, making noises she hadn't heard before. When we told her that Justice Ginsburg was in the audience, she collapsed to the floor. Justice Ginsburg then came backstage, which was delightful. She was sitting down and stood up to hug Thursday—I remember being incredibly moved by that.

She sent a nice letter to us afterward and asked us for a copy of the script. I told my stage manager I was nervous to send it to her, because I was sure she would find errors in it. He said, 'Oh, Heidi, stop it. She doesn't have time to read your play. This is just a symbolic act.'

A few days later, I got a Fedex package that had a copy of one of the cases that I discussed flagged with some things to look at, and then a letter thanking me for the script and giving me two notes. One had to do with changing a piece of language from 'would have' to 'might have.' She wanted me to be more precise with my language. The other one had to do with how to talk about the Equal Rights Amendment."

Beneath the front cover in this copy, Ginsburg has made three short autograph notes: "40 Castle Rock v Gonzalez 2005," the 2005 Supreme Court case that inspired the play; "43 If ERA she would have been protected," perhaps related to Schreck's "... how to talk about the Equal Rights Amendment"; and "NY just one state away."

Called by the New York Times "not just the best play to open on Broadway so far this season, but also the most important," Schreck's Constitution was produced for television by Amazon studios on the eve of the 2020 election. Schreck has won multiple awards as both actor and playwright, and stands as one of the brightest voices in American theater.





During her time in Sweden, Ginsburg immersed herself in Swedish culture, learning the language and examining how the social norms regarding women differed between Sweden and the United States. It was there that she saw the possibility of women's equality in society, and gained a vision of how America could be transformed by it.

Conditions of sale

The following Conditions of Sale, as amended by any published or posted notices or verbal announcements during the sale, constitute the entire terms and conditions on which property listed in the catalog shall be offered for sale or sold by Bonhams & Butterfields Auctioneers Corp. and any consignor of such property for whom Bonhams acts as agent. By participating in this sale, you agree to be bound by these terms and conditions.

If live online bidding is available for the subject auction, additional terms and conditions of sale relating to online bidding will apply; see www.bonhams.com/WebTerms for the supplemental terms. As used herein, "Bonhams," "we" and "us" refer to Bonhams & Butterfields Auctioneers Corp.

- As used herein, the term "bid price" means the price at which a lot is successfully knocked down to the buyer. The term "purchase price" means the aggregate of (a) the bid price, (b) a PREMIUM retained by us and payable by the buyer (the "buyer's premium"), EQUAL TO 27.5% OF THE FIRST \$12,500 OF THE BID PRICE, PLUS 25% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE BID PRICE ABOVE \$12,500 UP TO AND INCLUDING \$600,000, PLUS 20% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE BID PRICE ABOVE \$600,000 UP TO AND INCLUDING \$6,000,000, PLUS 14.5% OF THE AMOUNT OF THE BID PRICE ABOVE \$6,000,000, and (c) unless the buyer is exempt by law from the payment thereof, any Alabama, Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Texas, Utah, Virginia, Washington, D.C., Washington state, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming or other state or local sales tax (or compensating use tax) and other applicable taxes. With regard to New York sales tax, please refer to the "Sales and Use Tax" section of these Conditions of Sale.
- 2. In order to bid at the sale, prospective bidders must submit to Bonhams a completed bidder registration form (appearing at the end of this catalog) and any other requested information or references. New bidders and bidders who have not recently updated their registration information must pre-register to bid at least two business days before the sale. Individuals will be required to provide government-issued proof of identity and proof of address. Entity clients will be required to provide documentation including confirmation of entity registration showing the registered name, confirmation of registered address, documentary proof of officers and beneficial owners, proof of authority to transact on behalf of the entity and government-issued proof of identity for the individual who is transacting on the entity's behalf.

We may also request a financial reference and /or deposit from bidders before approving the bidder registration. In the event a deposit is submitted and you are not the successful bidder, your deposit will be returned to you. If you are the successful bidder, any such deposit will be credited to offset the appropriate portion of the purchase price.

We reserve the right to request further information, including regarding the source of funds, in order to complete bidder identification and registration procedures (including completing any anti-money laundering and/or anti-terrorism financing checks we may require) to our satisfaction. If our bidder identification and registration procedures are not satisfied, we may, in our sole discretion, decline to register any bidder or reject any bid or cancel any sale to such bidder.

Every bidder shall be deemed to act as a principal unless prior to the commencement of the sale there is a written acceptance by Bonhams of a bidder registration form completed and signed by the principal which clearly states that the authorized bidding agent is acting on behalf of the named principal. Absent such written acceptance by Bonhams, any person placing a bid as agent on behalf of another (whether or not such person has disclosed that fact or the identity of the principal) may be jointly and severally

liable with the principal under any contract resulting from the acceptance of a bid. Every bidder shall be responsible for any use of its assigned paddle or bidding account, regardless of the circumstances.

You represent and warrant that: (i) you have provided us with true and correct copies of valid identification and proof of residence and, if applicable, financial and/ or corporate documents; (ii) neither you, your principal (if applicable, and subject to Bonhams' prior written acceptance pursuant to paragraph 2 above), nor any individual or entity with a beneficial or ownership interest in either or in the purchase transaction is on the Specially Designated Nationals List maintained by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the U.S. Department of the Treasury nor subject to any other sanctions or embargo program or regulation in effect in the United States, European Union, England and Wales, or other applicable jurisdictions; (iii) if you are acting as an agent for a principal, you have conducted appropriate due diligence into such principal, and agree that Bonhams shall be entitled to rely upon such due diligence, you will retain adequate records evidencing such due diligence for a period of five (5) years following the consummation of the sale, and will make these records available for inspection upon Bonhams' request; (vi) neither the purchase transaction (including your bidding activity) nor the purchase funds are connected with nor derive from any criminal activity, and they are not designed to nor have they or shall they, violate the banking, anti-money laundering, or currency transfer laws or other regulations (including without limitation, import-export laws) of any country or jurisdiction, or further any other unlawful purpose, including without limitation collusion, anti-competitive activity, tax evasion or tax fraud.

You acknowledge and agree that we may rely upon the accuracy and completeness of the foregoing warranties.

4. On the fall of the auctioneer's hammer, the highest bidder shall have purchased the offered lot in accordance and subject to compliance with all of the conditions set forth herein and (a) assumes full risk and responsibility therefor, (b) if requested will sign a confirmation of purchase, and (c) will pay the purchase price in full or such part as we may require for all lots purchased. No lot may be transferred.

Unless otherwise agreed, payment in good, cleared funds is due and payable within five (5) business days following the auction sale. Whenever the buyer pays only a part of the total purchase price for one or more lots purchased, we may apply such payments, in our sole discretion, to the lot or lots we choose. Payment will not be deemed made in full until we have received good, cleared funds for all amounts due. Title in any purchased property will not pass until full and final payment has been received by Bonhams. Accounts must be settled in full before property is released to the buyer. In the event property is released earlier, such release will not affect the passing of title or the buyer's obligation to timely remit full payment.

We reserve the right to refuse to accept payment from a source other than the registered bidder or buyer of record. Once an invoice is issued, we cannot change the buyer's name on an invoice.

Payment for purchases must be made in the currency in which the sale is conducted. Bonhams' preferred payment method is by wire transfer. For final purchases exceeding US \$25,000.00, all payments must be in the form of wire transfer unless other arrangements have been approved in advance. For final purchases below US \$25,000.00, payment may also be made in or by the following methods:

- () Cash. Please note that the amount of cash that can be accepted from a given purchaser is limited to US \$5,000 per auction sale (whether by single or multiple related payments). If the amount payable exceeds that sum, the balance must be paid by another method.
- (ii) Cashier's check, money order, or personal check with approved credit drawn on a U.S. bank. A processing fee will be assessed on any returned checks.
- (iii) Visa, MasterCard, American Express or Discover debit

or credit card issued in the name of the purchaser or record. Only one debit or credit card may be used for payment of an account balance. This method of payment may not be available to first time purchasers.

To the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, the buyer grants us a security interest in the property, and we may retain as collateral security for the buyer's obligations to us, any property and all monies held or received by us for the account of the buyer, in our possession. We also retain all rights of a secured party under the Uniform Commercial Code (which shall mean the New York Uniform Commercial Code, except where the Uniform Commercial Code of another state governs the perfection of a security interest in collateral located in that state), and you agree that we may file financing statements without your signature. If the foregoing conditions or any other applicable conditions herein are not complied with, in addition to all other remedies available to us and the consignor by law, we may at our election: (a) hold the buyer liable for the full purchase price and any late charges, collection costs, attorneys' fees and costs, expenses and incidental damages incurred by us or the consignor arising out of the buyer's breach; (b) cancel the sale, retaining as liquidated damages all payments made by the buyer; and/or (c) cancel the sale and/or resell the purchased property, at public auction and/or by private sale, and in such event the buyer shall be liable for the payment of all consequential damages, including any deficiencies or monetary losses, and all costs and expenses of such sale or sales, our commissions at our standard rates, all other charges due hereunder, all late charges, collection costs, attorneys' fees and costs, expenses and incidental damages. In addition, where two or more amounts are owed in respect of different transactions by the buyer to us, to Bonhams 1793 Limited and/or to any of our other affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide within the Bonhams Group, we reserve the right to apply any monies paid in respect of a transaction to discharge any amount owed by the buyer. If all fees, commissions, premiums, bid prices and other sums due to us from the buyer are not paid promptly as provided in these Conditions of Sale, we reserve the right to impose a finance charge equal to 1.5% per month (or, if lower, the maximum nonusurious rate of interest permitted by applicable law), on all amounts due to us beginning on the 31st day following the sale until payment is received, in addition to other remedies available to us by law.

- 5. We reserve the right to withdraw any property and to divide and combine lots at any time before such property's auction. Unless otherwise announced by the auctioneer at the time of sale, all bids are per lot as numbered in the catalog and no lots shall be divided or combined for sale.
- 6. We reserve the right to reject a bid from any bidder, to split any bidding increment, and to advance the bidding in any manner the auctioneer may decide. In the event of any dispute between bidders, or in the event the auctioneer doubts the validity of any bid, the auctioneer shall have sole and final discretion either to determine the successful bidder, re-open the bidding, or to cancel the sale and re-offer and resell the article in dispute. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sales records shall be conclusive in all respects.

We further reserve the right to cancel the sale of any property if (i) you are in breach of your representations and warranties as set forth in paragraph 3 above; (ii) we, in our sole discretion, determine that such transaction might be unlawful or might subject Bonhams or the consignor to any liability to any third party; or (iii) there are any other grounds for cancellation under these Conditions of Sale.

- 7. If we are prevented by fire, theft or any other reason whatsoever from delivering any property to the buyer or a sale otherwise cannot be completed, our liability shall be limited to the sum actually paid therefor by the buyer and shall in no event include any compensatory, incidental or consequential damages.
- 8. All lots in the catalog are offered subject to a reserve unless otherwise indicated in the catalog. The reserve is the

confidential minimum bid price at which such lot will be sold and it does not to exceed the low estimate value for the lot. If a lot is offered subject to a reserve, we may implement such reserve by bidding on behalf of the consignor, whether by opening bidding or continuing bidding in response to other bidders until reaching the reserve. If we have an interest in an offered lot and the proceeds therefrom other than our commissions, we may bid up to the reserve to protect such interest. If the auctioneer determines that any opening or subsequent bid is below the reserve for a lot, (s)he may reject such opening bid and withdraw the item from sale. CONSIGNORS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO BID ON THEIR OWN ITEMS.

- Other than as provided in the Limited Right of Rescission with respect to identification of authorship, all property is sold "AS IS" and any statements contained in the catalog or in any advertisement, bill of sale, announcement, condition report, invoice or elsewhere as to period, culture, source, origin, media, measurements, size, quality, rarity, provenance, importance, exhibition and literature of historical relevance, merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, or physical condition ARE QUALIFIED STATEMENTS OF OPINION AND NOT REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, OR ASSUMPTION OF LIABILITY. Neither Bonhams nor the consignor shall be responsible for any error or omission in the catalog description of any property. No employee or agent of Bonhams is authorized to make on our behalf or on that of the consignor any representation or warranty, oral or written, with respect to any property.
- 10. All purchased property shall be removed from the premises at which the sale is conducted by the date(s) and time(s) set forth in the "Buyer's Guide" portion of this catalog. If not so removed, daily storage fees will be payable to us by the buyer as set forth therein. We reserve the right to transfer property not so removed to an offsite warehouse at the buyer's risk and expense, as set forth in more detail in the "Buyer's Guide." Packing and handling of purchased lots are the responsibility of the buyer and at the buyer's entire risk, as are the identification, application for, and cost(s) of obtaining of any necessary export, import, restricted material (e.g. endangered species) or other permit for such lots.

For an additional fee, Bonhams may provide packing and shipping services for certain items as noted in the "Buyer's Guide" section of the catalog.

- 11. The copyright in the text of the catalog and the photographs, digital images and illustrations of lots in the catalog belong to Bonhams or our licensors. You will not reproduce or permit anyone else to reproduce such text, photographs, digital images or illustrations without our prior written consent. Bonhams and the consignor make no representation or warranty as to whether the buyer acquires any copyrights on the purchase of an item of Property.
- Bonhams may, in our discretion, as a courtesy and free of charge, execute bids on your behalf if so instructed by you, provided that neither Bonhams nor our employees or agents will be liable for any error or default (whether human or otherwise) in doing so or for failing to do so. Without limiting the foregoing, Bonhams (including our agents and employees) shall not be responsible for any problem relating to telephone, online, or other bids submitted remotely through any means, including without limitation, any telecommunications or internet fault or failure, or breakdown or problems with any devices or online platforms, including third-party online platforms, regardless of whether such issue arises with our, your, or such third-party's technology, equipment, or connection. By participating at auction by telephone or online, bidders expressly consent to the recording of their bidding sessions and related communications with Bonhams and our employees and agents, and acknowledge their acceptance of these Conditions of Sale as well as any additional terms. and conditions applicable to any such bidding platform or technology.
- 13. These Conditions of Sale shall bind the successors

and assigns of all bidders and buyers and inure to the benefit of our successors and assigns. No waiver, amendment or modification of the terms hereof (other than posted notices or oral announcements during the sale) shall bind us unless specifically stated in writing and signed by us. No act or omission of Bonhams, its employees or agents, nor any failure thereof to exercise any remedy hereunder, shall operate or be deemed to operate as a waiver of Bonhams' rights under these Conditions of Sale. If any part of these Conditions of Sale is for any reason invalid or unenforceable, the rest shall remain valid and enforceable.

- 14. These Conditions of Sale and the buyer's and our respective rights and obligations hereunder shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York. Any dispute, controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this agreement, or the breach, termination or validity thereof, brought by or against Bonhams (but not including claims brought against the consignor by the buyer of lots consigned hereunder) shall be resolved by the procedures set forth below.
- 15. You accept and agree that Bonhams will hold and process your personal information and may share and use it as required by law and as described in, and in line with Bonhams' Privacy Policy, available at website at www. bonhams.com/legals/. If you desire access, update, or restriction to the use of your personal information, please email data.protection@bonhams.com.

SALES AND USE TAX

New York sales tax is charged on the hammer price, buyer's premium and any other applicable charges on any property collected or delivered in New York State, regardless of the state or country in which the buyer resides or does business. Buyers who make direct arrangements for collection by a shipper who is considered a "private" or "contract" carrier by the New York Department of Taxation and Finance will be charged New York sales tax, regardless of the destination of the property. Property collected for delivery to a destination outside of New York by a shipper who is considered a "common carrier" by the New York Department of Taxation and Finance (e.g. United States Postal Service, United Parcel Service, and FedEx) is not subject to New York sales tax, but if it is delivered into any state in which Bonhams is registered or otherwise conducts business sufficient to establish a nexus. Bonhams may be required by law to collect and remit the appropriate sales tax in effect in such state. Property collected for delivery outside of the United States by a freightforwarder who is registered with the Transportation Security Administration ("TSA") is not subject to New York sales tax.

MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION PROCEDURES

- (a) Within 30 days of written notice that there is a dispute, the parties or their authorized and empowered representatives shall meet by telephone and/or in person to mediate their differences. If the parties agree, a mutually acceptable mediator shall be selected and the parties will equally share the fees and expenses of mediation. The mediator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling mediations. Any communications made during the mediation process shall not be admissible in any subsequent mediation, arbitration or judicial proceeding. All proceedings and any resolutions thereof shall be confidential, and the terms governing arbitration set forth in paragraph (c) below shall govern.
- (b) If mediation does not resolve all disputes between the parties, or in any event no longer than 60 days after receipt of the written notice of dispute referred to above, the parties shall submit the dispute for binding arbitration before a single neutral arbitrator. Such arbitrator shall be a retired judge or an attorney familiar with commercial law and trained in or qualified by experience in handling arbitrations. Such arbitrator shall make all appropriate disclosures required by law. The arbitrator shall be drawn from a panel of a national or international arbitration service agreed to by the parties,

and shall be selected as follows: (i) If the arbitration service has specific rules or procedures, those rules or procedures shall be followed; (ii) If the arbitration service does not have rules or procedures for the selection of an arbitrator, the arbitrator shall be an individual jointly agreed to by the parties. If the parties cannot agree on an arbitration service, the arbitration shall be conducted by Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services, Inc. ("JAMS") or another national or international alternative dispute resolution ("ADR") provider of Bonhams' choice, and the arbitrator shall be selected in accordance with JAMS' Streamlined Arbitration Rules and Procedures or the rules of the other ADR provider selected by Bonhams. The arbitrator's award shall be in writing and shall set forth findings of fact and legal conclusions.

- (c) Unless otherwise agreed to by the parties or provided by the published rules of the arbitration service:
 - (i) The arbitration shall occur within 60 days following the selection of the arbitrator;
 - (ii) The arbitration shall be conducted in New York, New York; and
 - (iii) Discovery and the procedure for the arbitration shall be as follows:
 - A. All arbitration proceedings shall be confidential;
 B. The parties shall submit written briefs to the arbitrator no later than 15 days before the arbitration commences:
 - C. Discovery, if any, shall be limited as follows:

 (1) Requests for no more than 10 categories of documents, to be provided to the requesting party within 14 days of written request therefor;

 (11) No more than two (2) depositions per party, provided however, the deposition(s) are to be completed within one (1) day; (111) Compliance with the above shall be enforced by the arbitrator in accordance with New York law;
 - D. Each party shall have no longer than eight (8) hours to present its position. The entire hearing before the arbitrator shall not take longer than three (3) consecutive days;
 - E. The award shall be made in writing no more than 30 days following the end of the proceeding. Judgment upon the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered by any court having jurisdiction thereof.

To the fullest extent permitted by law, and except as required by applicable arbitration rules, each party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs in connection with the proceedings and shall share equally the fees and expenses of the arbitration.

LIMITED RIGHT OF RESCISSION

If within one (1) year from the date of sale, the original buyer (a) gives written notice to us alleging that the identification of Authorship (as defined below) of such lot as set forth in the UPPERCASE TYPE heading of the catalog description of such lot (as amended by any saleroom notices or verbal announcements during the sale) is not substantially correct based on a fair reading of the catalog (including the terms of any glossary contained therein), and (b) within 10 days after such notice returns the lot to us in the same condition as at the time of sale, and (c) establishes the allegation in the notice to our satisfaction (including by providing one or more written opinions by recognized experts in the field, as we may reasonably require), then the sale of such lot will be rescinded and, unless we have already paid to the consignor monies owed him in connection with the sale, the original purchase price will be refunded.

If, prior to receiving such notice from the original buyer alleging such defect, we have paid the consignor monies owed him in connection with the sale, we shall pay the original buyer the amount of our commissions, any other sale proceeds to which we are entitled and applicable taxes received from the buyer on the sale and make demand on the consignor to pay the balance of the original purchase price to the original buyer. Should the consignor fail to pay such amount promptly, we may disclose the identity of

the consignor and assign to the original buyer our rights against the consignor with respect to the lot the sale of which is sought to be rescinded. Upon such disclosure and assignment, any liability of Bonhams as consignor's agent with respect to said lot shall automatically terminate.

The foregoing limited right of rescission is available to the original buyer only and may not be assigned to or relied upon by any subsequent transferee of the property sold. The buyer hereby accepts the benefit of the consignor's warranty of title and other representations and warranties made by the consignor for the buyer's benefit. Nothing in this section shall be construed as an admission by us of any representation of fact, express or implied, obligation or responsibility with respect to any lot. THE BUYER'S SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE REMEDY AGAINST BONHAMS FOR ANY REASON WHATSOEVER IS THE LIMITED RIGHT OF RESCISSION DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION.

"Authorship" means only the identity of the creator, the period, culture and source or origin of the lot, as the case may be, as set forth in the UPPERCASE TYPE heading of the print catalog entry. AUCTION ESTIMATES

PROFESSIONAL APPRAISAL SERVICES

Bonhams' specialists conduct insurance and fair market value appraisals for private collectors, corporations, museums, fiduciaries and government entities on a daily basis. Insurance appraisals, used for insurance purposes, reflect the cost of replacing property in today's retail market. Fair market value appraisals are used for estate, tax and family division purposes and reflect prices paid by a willing buyer to a willing seller.

When we conduct a private appraisal, our specialists will prepare a thorough inventory listing of all your appraised property by category. Valuations, complete descriptions and locations of items are included in the documentation.

Catalogs

Before each auction we publish illustrated catalogs. Our catalogs provide descriptions and estimated values for each "lot." A lot may refer to a single item or to a group of items auctioned together. The catalogs also include the dates and the times for the previews and auctions. We offer our catalogs by subscription or by single copy. For information on subscribing to our catalogs, you may refer to the subscription form in this catalog, call our Client Services Department, or visit our website at www.bonhams.com/us.

Previews

Auction previews are your chance to inspect each lot prior to the auction. We encourage you to look closely and examine each object on which you may want to bid so that you will know as much as possible about it. Except as expressly set forth in the Conditions of Sale, items are sold "as is" and with all faults; illustrations in our catalogs, website and other materials are provided for identification only. 
